Worker**

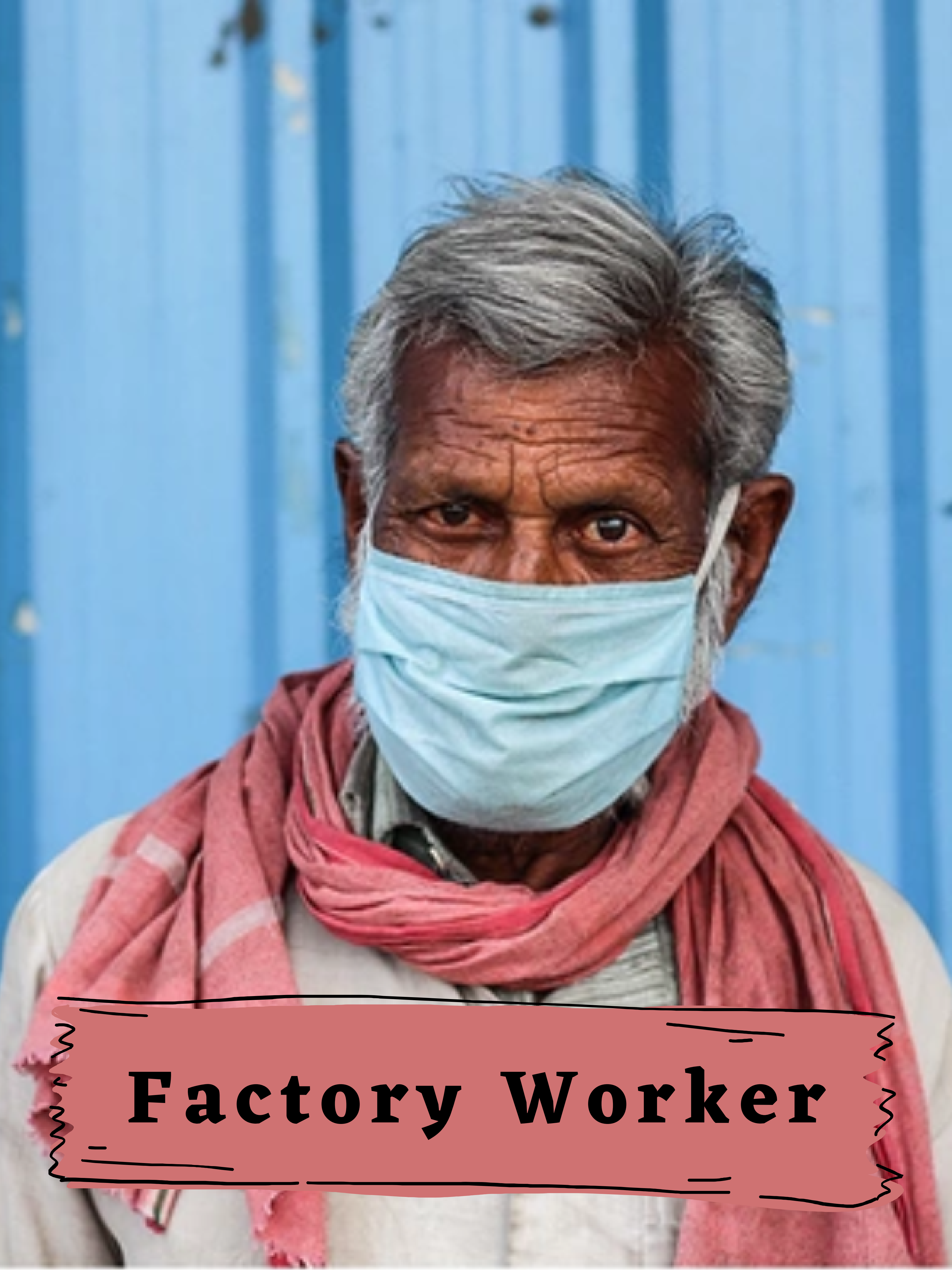
Occupation: Chemical Dyes Worker

It can be very taxing as I must clean with toxic cleaning solvents and no gloves. I hope to go back home and visit my children some days. My family needs the money.
